Sports Premium Funding 2016 - 2017

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to school for the next academic year (2016-2017).

The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children of primary age the school has. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision and increased participation in PE and Sport.

At Edmondsley Primary School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all pupils.

The award for Edmondsley this year was £8700.

The 7 Government priorities for use of the Sports Premium funding were as follows:

- Achieving high quality PE
- Increasing participation and inclusion
- Promoting healthy, active lifestyles
- Providing competitive school sport
- Developing leadership, the curriculum and subject profile
- Contributing to pupils' overall achievement
- Developing partnerships

Below is a breakdown of how the funding for 2016/ 2017 was spent.

Increased participation and competition between schools. Advice drawn on to develop our curriculum to ensure high quality provision has been delivered.
Swimming SLA	£2500 To provide the delivery of high quality swimming teaching in year 3.	All Year 3 children participated in swimming lessons regularly. % of children who could swim at least 25m increased.
Skipping Workshop Kidz R Fit Hula Hoop day	£350 and £360 per event. All children to take part. Aim to get whole school skipping and hula hooping.	2 whole school workshops were delivered. Children were more engaged in hula hooping and skipping, as seen during OPAL breaks. Hula hoop after-school club was initially well attended.
Coaches – basketball	£150 Staff up skilled through working alongside specialist teacher. Improved delivery of high quality PE.	Teacher felt more confident in delivering high-quality basketball sessions. Ideas and activities cascaded amongst staff.

Change 4 Life Club	£250 To encourage those children who do not engage with PE and sport	The club was well-attended and children who attended engaged more fully in sporting activities through mentoring and coaching from Change 4 Life staff.
Affiliation to CLS Schools Athletics Association. Affiliation to CLS Schools Football Association. Access to County competitions and pathway to ESFA national competitions. Affiliation to CLS Schools Tag Rugby Association. Affiliation to CLS Schools Netball Association.	£20 Provides access to high quality competition, track and cross country events that has a 50 year history of competition in the community. £50 Provides access to high quality competition in football across KS2 and girls. £20 Provides access to high quality, local Tag Rugby competition. £20 Provides access to high quality, local competition and leagues in netball.	Affiliation with associations allowed the school to take part in further, specialist competitions. This developed partnerships between our school and other local schools as well as giving children who were more able an opportunity to compete in competitive games.
Equipment – PE mats	£500 Increased class sizes required additional mats to provide high quality gymnastics lessons	PE mats are now being used regularly, which has allowed all children to be active throughout lessons.
Transport to festivals.	£1000 Allows as many children as possible to participate in Level 2 and 3 competitions.	All festivals, which the school signed up to, were attended, with no cost passed on to parents. This allowed us to compete against other schools in a competitive arena.

All children active and riding wheeled vehicles.</p>	<p>The balance bikes have been used regularly and effectively by children at lunch and play times, which has let children increase their participation and inclusion in active playtimes. This has led to OPAL continuing to promote healthy, active lifestyles.</p>
