Our Objectives will be to:

- Sequence short narratives orally and pictorially
- Name the letters of the alphabet in order
- Begin to spell common words correctly (e.g. was, boy, are, looked)
- Show an awareness of how full stops are used in Writing or Reading
- Organise writing correctly (top to bottom, left to right)
- Distinguish between lower case letters and capital letters

MUSIC

Our Objectives will be to:

- Find ways to add expression to singing.
- Make different sounds using our voices.
- Learn chants and rhymes.
- Listen to different forms of chants.
- Listen to traditional rhymes from around the world.

GEOGRAPHY/HISTORY

My life, my world

During topic lessons we will be learning about how transport has changed over time and beginning to draw maps.

Our Objectives will be to:

- Use maps to locate the four countries and capital cities of UK and its surrounding seas
- Draw basic maps, including appropriate symbols
- Use photographs and maps to identify features
- Develop, then demonstrate an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time
- Discuss change and continuity in an aspect of life,
- Recognise what happened as a result of people's actions

MATHS

Measurement, Mental addition and subtraction, Basic multiplication and division

Our Objectives will be to:

- Read and write numbers and number-names to 20.
- Begin to add single digits together
- Begin to subtract one single digit from another
- Share objects into groups equally
- Find half of an objects
- Measure objects using non-standard units
- Find the capacity of different containers
- Recognise the value of different coins and notes
