Read a book and write a book review. Include your favourite characters, a summary of the plot and how the story could be improved.	Write down all the prime numbers up to 50. Explain to an adult why they are prime numbers.	Research pictures of witches (parents may want to check safety settings) over the past 300 years. Write how people's ideas about them have changed.	Watch a Harry Potter film with your family. At the end of the film, discuss which parts of the film you liked.
Write a diary entry of your Easter holiday. What did you do? How was it different from last Easter?	Create 6 five digit numbers. Add two of these together to create three sums.
