English

1. Read the sentences below, underline the verb, highlight the adverbial. Write what question the adverbial answers - When, Where or How. Remember: adverbials tell us more about the verb.
The first has been done for you.
1. Little Mouse shivered near the cobwebs. WHERE
2. At night, he peered under the bed. 3. With great care, he avoided sharp knives around the house. 4. Little Mouse hid in the cupboard. *Make up your own sentences with adverbials.

"Add-A-Letter" spelling game. Player 1 starts writing a spelling word on paper by writing one letter. The next one adds the next letter. Since many spellings include words that start with the same sounds, it may be challenging to know which word your partner started writing, can you work together to complete the spellings accurately?

Conjunctions are words that join clauses into sentences. E.g. He is extremely unusual because he is a spider man. The underlined words are clauses and **because** is the conjunction joining them. Create sentences using these conjunctions: because, while, after, before, so, since when, until, where, as.



What is the creature behind the tree?
What are those large sacks hanging from the branches?
How do you think Bilbo is feeling?
What will happen after he puts the ring on his finger?

Find the equivalent fractions - if you're stuck, google a fraction wall or find one on twinkl to help you. Extension: Find your own equivalent fractions.

Measure 10 different objects around your home try to be as accurate as possible. Order the objects from smallest to largest. What is the difference in cm between the smallest and largest object? How many mm are in a cm? How many cm are in a m?

Collect data for a graph: e.g. number of different trees spotted on a daily walk, different colours of cars passing your house etc. Create a graph on the computer or by hand to represent your findings. Ask an adult to ask you 5 maths questions about your graph.

Roll a dice to generate a 2-digit number. Using mental maths, figure out what you add to each number rolled to make 100.

Wider Curriculum

Take some photos of nature or you family. Can you format the images using the computer programmes or even a phone with a grownup's permission and supervision? Change their size, colour, effects. Make a collage of your formatted pictures.

Make a bird feeder using a plastic bottle- feed the birds and reuse plastic!
