




Home Learning Grid

Choose numbers within 5, 10 or 20. Eg there were 8 people on a bus. 2 more got on. How many are on the bus now? But at the next stop 1 person got off. How many are left on the bus? If you want a challenge try to record these stories as addition or subtraction sentences. $8+2=10$ / $10-1=9$</p>	<p>Place a bucket or plastic pot outside in an area it can collect rain. Every day measure how much water is in your container. Which day was the wettest?</p>	<p>How do we cross the road? Speak to your family and find out about the 'Green Cross Code'. Practice road safety in your garden then make sure you use your new skill when crossing a road.</p>
 <p>Write a few sentences about this picture. What can you see? What has happened? What will happen next? Remember to use full stops and capital letters.</p>	<p>All about the Number 20 Home Learning Challenges</p> <p>Use recyclable materials to create a number 20 rocket. Write the number on the rocket and practise counting backwards from 20 to blast off.</p> 	<p>Check on the seeds you planted a few weeks ago. Has anything happened? Draw a picture of what you see in pot 1,2,3 and 4.</p>	<p>Make a crepe paper obstacle course criss cross it from one wall to another, leaving just small gaps for the kids to climb through. See if they can make it through the course without tearing the paper.</p>
